- I. Action against sureties to sealed instruments, three years
- J. Scire facias cannot be maintained after 21 years
- K. Lien on real estate for only 5 years which may be revived every 5 years.
- L. Lien on bond for only 10 years which may be revived every 10 years.
- M. Excepting that when execution issues and is returned, by an officer within 1 year, other executions may issue scire facias or action be brought within 20 years.
- N. Witnessed notes good for 14 years.
- O. Contracts not directly for payment of money, barred in five years.
- P. Non negotiable note.
- Q. Oral contract except subject of book debt.
- R. A sealed instrument in equity, is not barred until after 20 years.
